Access to the PDBP Data Management Resource


The National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke (NINDS) Parkinson's Disease Biomarkers Program Data Management Resource (PDBP DMR) is a web-based tool and a valuable resource for the Parkinson's Disease Biomarkers Community.

The goal of the PDBP is to support new and existing research and resource development promoting biomarker discovery for Parkinson's Disease.

The PDBP DMR includes development of a web-based data management system that provides tools to PDBP supported projects for both the collection and quality assurance of data in a standardized format. The PDBP DMR also coordinates the assembly of de-identified data into a common database thus enabling the query and distribution of aggregate data for the acceleration of PD biomarkers discovery and validation.

In order to access PDBP DMR, the user needs to request a user account.

Why request an account to PDBP Data Management Resource?

The users will need an account if they

- Want to submit data as PDBP researchers to PDBP DMR;
- Want to request data from PDBP DMR;
- Want to request biosamples.

Requesting an account to PDBP

To request access to the PDBP Data Management Resource (DMR), please fill out the online account request form.

You are also required to upload a signed *PDBP Data Use Certificate* with your request.

In order to download the agreement,

1. Navigate to the PDBP web site,
2. Find the *PDBP DMR Data Use Certification Agreement* link,
3. Download the document (in MS Word).

Your request will be reviewed by the PDBP DMR Data Access Committee to verify your intended use is appropriate and your affiliated institution is recognized as a research organization. You will be notified by email if your account request has been approved.

To reach the the online account request form,

1. Navigate to the PDBP DMR
2. Click the Request An New Account link. The Account Management page appears.
3. Fill out the Account Management form (2 pages).

On the he Account Management page,

1. Fill out all required fields - ones that have a red asterisk (*).
2. Press Continue, you will be navigated to the Account Privileges page.
3. On the Account Privileges page, use check boxes to select privileges you wish to apply for. Note that the basic set of privileges which grants a general access to the system is already pre-selected. Read more: [Selecting Privileges](#).
4. Navigate to the Upload Additional Files section and use the File Upload box to upload additional support documentation, if needed. Press Upload to start upload.
5. Press Submit Request to submit you request.

 You are required to upload a signed PDBP Data Use Certificate with your request. Your request will be reviewed by the PDBP DMR Data Access Committee to verify your intended use is appropriate and your affiliated institution is recognized as a research organization. You will be notified by email if your account request has been approved.

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Selecting privileges

The basic set of privileges which grants a general access to the system is pre-selected on the page 2 of the Access Management form. To select additional privileges, use the check boxes. **There are several levels of user privileges in the system:**

- User - this level provides a general access to the system, granted by default.
- Data Dictionary - this level gives the user an access to the data dictionary. It also allows the user to view, define, create and modify the common and unique data elements, and form structures.
- GUID - this level allows the user to access the GUID tool and generate GUIDs.
- Study - this level allows the user to create and view studies, which contain research data and supportive documentation.
- Query Tool - this level grants the user permission to mine data and downloaded query results.
- ProFoRMS - this level grants the user access to ProFoRMS.


